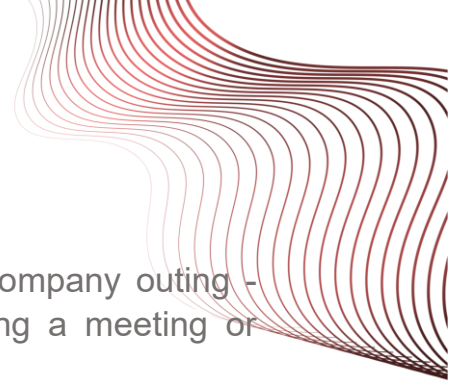
How it Works:

During this desert survival team-building activity, participants will face the challenge of constructing a shelter to shield themselves from the scorching heat and potential dangers. They will collaboratively utilize available materials, like rocks and branches, to create a sturdy and comfortable shelter in a strategic location. Creating a visible and effective rescue signal is vital for attracting potential help, and the team will work together to devise a plan for visible signals using rocks, bright materials, or distress signs on the ground. To navigate the desert, participants will learn essential orienteering techniques, using the sun, stars, or natural landmarks as guides, and may have access to compasses or other navigation tools. By mastering these mechanics, the team will improve their chances of surviving and thriving in the desert wilderness.
